DO IT YOURSELF OPTIONS:

1. Cameras: Smaller and more inexpensive than ever, cameras can be placed nearly anywhere on the exterior of your home and monitored from inside wirelessly -- or set to record footage for

review later.

- 2. Lights: Motion-detecting floodlights are an excellent deterrent to thieves, because they do not want to be seen. Make sure they are installed near entryways, and that they are not easily reached from the ground. Using timers for interior lights is a also a good way to give the appearance that your home is occupied.
- 3. Alarms: Vibration alarms are available for windows, alerting you if someone is trying to get in. Similarly, other monitors can be installed near doors and programmed to sound if a person comes within a set distance.

Even if you are not interesting in installing security equipment around your home, there are a number of things you can do to increase safety:

*Keep your home locked. It sounds simple, but you would be surprised how many people leave windows or doors unlocked.

*Don't leave a key outside. If you need to provide access to your home while you are away, leave a key with a trusted neighbor.

*Watch the landscaping. Thick shrubs and bushes around your porch or yard can give thieves a good place to hide.

*Use common sense. If you are going away on vacation, cancel your newspaper or other deliveries. As a neighbor to keep a watch. Don't post publicly on social media about being away.

Spring Home Maintenance

When spring time rolls around, almost everyone thinks of cleaning. However, there is something even more important to keep in mind: home maintenance. Here is a list of things to check around your house this spring!

- Check your crawlspace for any signs of standing water or dripping.
- Pull your dryer out and clean the exhaust hose and vent.
- · Vacuum refrigerator/freezer coils for efficiency.
- · Clean exhaust fan outlets and screens.
- Check all air filters and replace, if necessary.
- · Check for damage to your roof and have a professional inspection, if necessary.
- Go into the attic. If there is visible moisture or discoloration, your roof might be leaking.
- · Examine the paint on your siding and trim.
- · Check for leaks around window and door sills
- · Check for signs of rodents and other pests.
- · Clean debris from gutters and downspouts.
- Trim overhanging tree branches and shrubs.

Remember, winter weather can cause significant damage that is easy to spot, but is often results in wear and tear that homeowners can miss if they are not looking closely. It is well worth it to spend a little time on home maintenance this spring, so that wear and tear does not turn into something more serious.
